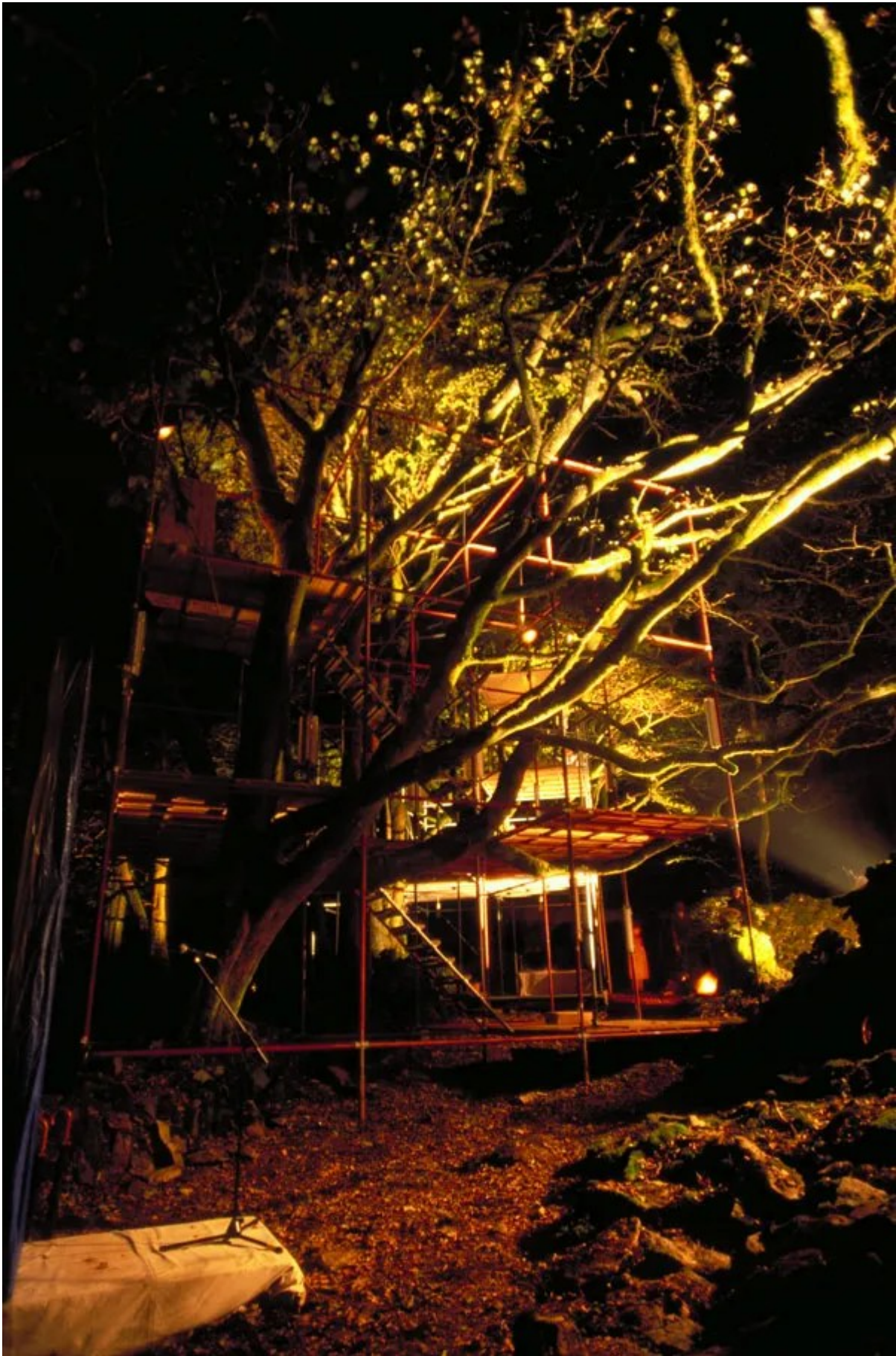


MANCHESTER UK – ARCHAEOLOGY AND PERFORMANCE
