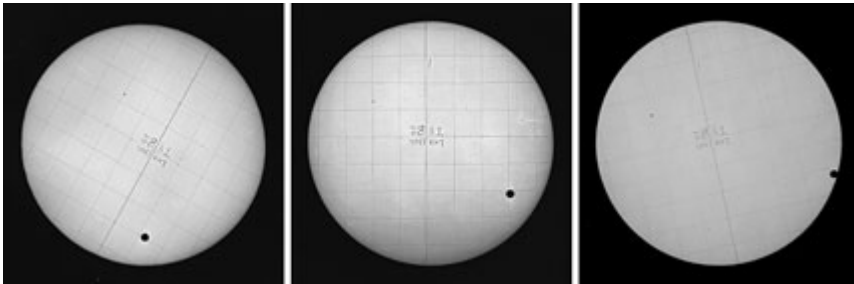


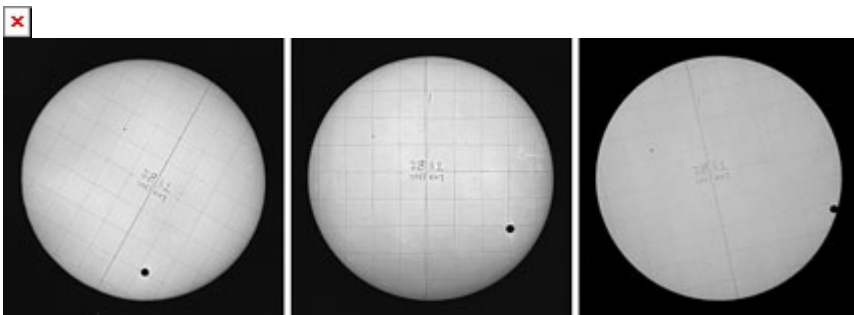
MEDIA ARCHAEOLOGY – THE VENUS TRANSIT OF 1882 – A RETURN OF WHAT NEVER WAS
