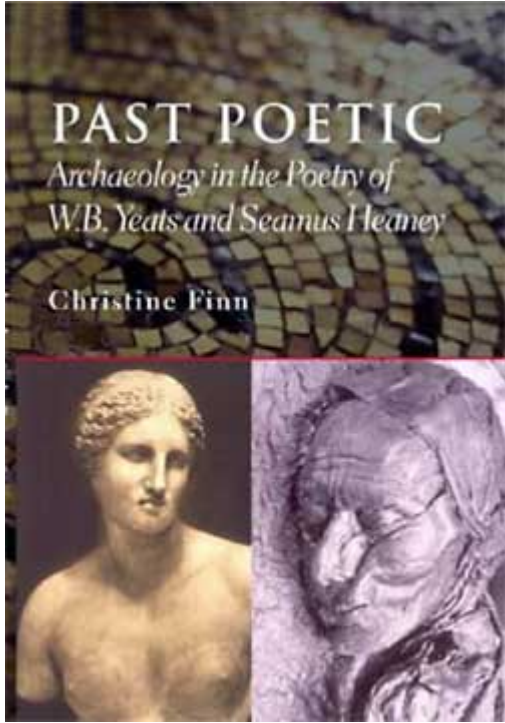


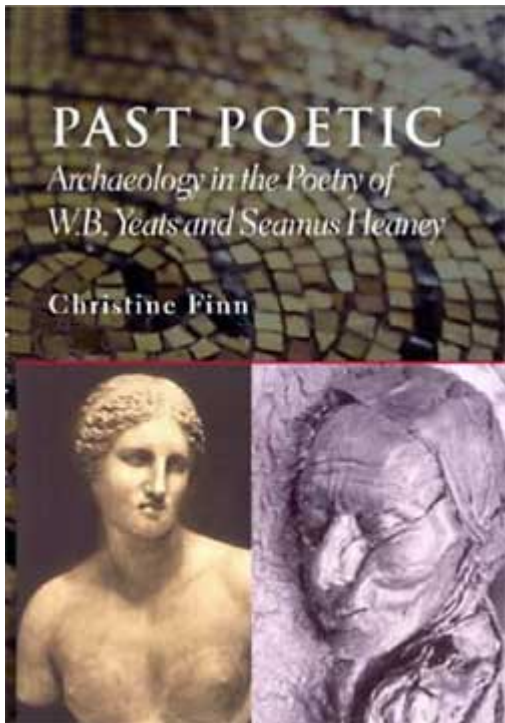
ON THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL IMAGINARY



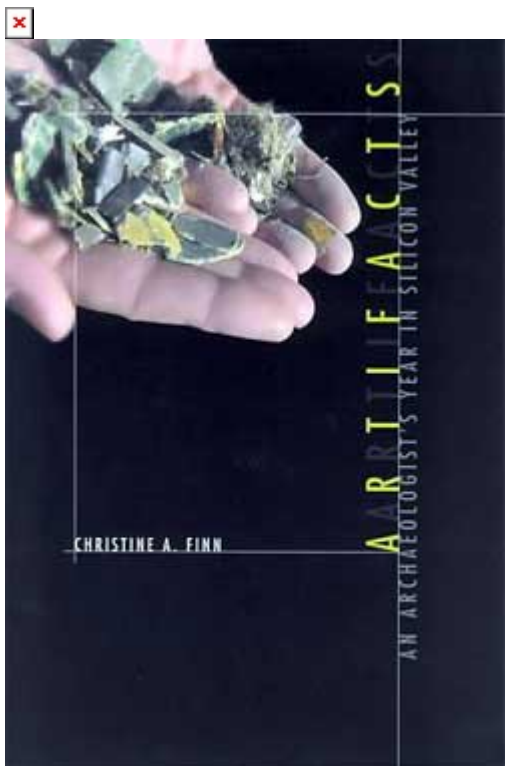
I forgot to mention in my recent post three key thinkers who are working through the archaeological imagination.
